Why Fine Arts courses are vital to a well rounded education...



Students who complete more arts classes are:

- Up to 112% more likely to score **EXCEPTIONAL** on standardized tests
- TWICE as likely to graduate
- 20% more likely to attend college



IMPROVED BRAIN DEVELOPMENT

Peer reviewed research over decades has shown how participation in fine arts improves brain function- including how practicing music increases synapses and gray matter and participating in dance increases mood boosting neurochemicals**



WORKFORCE SKILLS

Fine arts classes develop 21st century skills such as: creativity, collaboration, critical thinking, communication, perseverance and problem solving



SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL **DEVELOPMENT**

Arts can reduce the risk of depression by 48%* Arts education naturally develops necessary Social and Emotional Learning skills



COLLEGE READINESS*

- Up to 46% more likely to pass Texas Success Initiative (TSI) criteria
- Twice as likely to meet AP/IB exam criteria
